Thanks to all who support HICH in any way. If you would like to support us further, we are presently in need of more volunteers to help in the Op-shop.

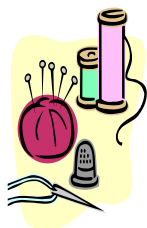

Mission of the Month –

The Anglican Board of Mission bases its work on what Jesus asked us to do: Love thy

neighbour. This is done by developing relationships and working in partnerships within Australia and many areas throughout the globe.

The partners of ABM are the Anglican Church of the country of mission and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Anglicans.

The ABM's programs work by training and educating the local clergy and church leaders to be able to effectively run and lead their parishes.

This work brings the knowledge of Jesus and the scriptures to the people of the community.

Community Development is another aspect of ABM's work – making communities more resilient and able to respond to their needs.

Programs include health services, adult literacy, sanitation, food security, social inclusion and more.

Within Australia the ABM works with Indigenous and Torres Strait people towards reconciliation. There is recognition that past mistakes have been made and the First Nation people need to be listened to, through NATSIAC and similar organisations.
